But did you know that you can edit your document in Print Preview and retain the updates when you return to the Normal view?

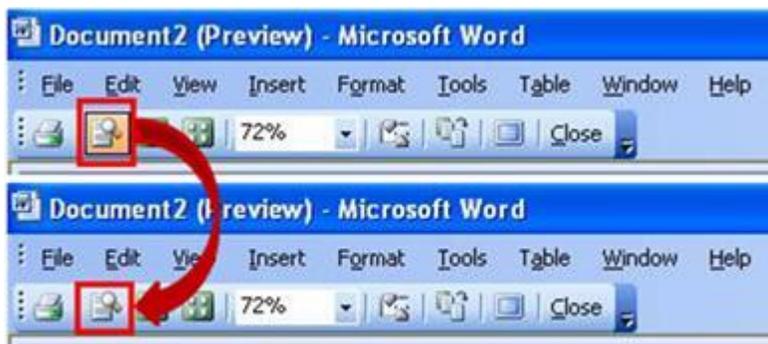

How to Edit Text of a Document in PRINT PREVIEW

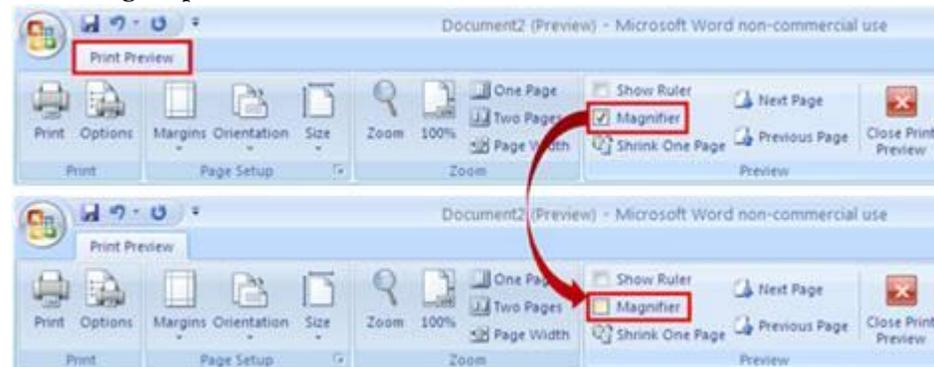
MS Word 2003

In the Print Preview toolbar, click the Magnifier icon .



MS Word 2007

In the Print Preview toolbar, uncheck the Magnifier checkbox in the Preview group.



This will **disable** the magnifier tool and change the mouse pointer to an **insertion point marker** (or **I-beam**), similar to what you use and see in Normal view.

When the pointer changes **from a magnifying glass to an I-beam**, you can now make your changes to the document.

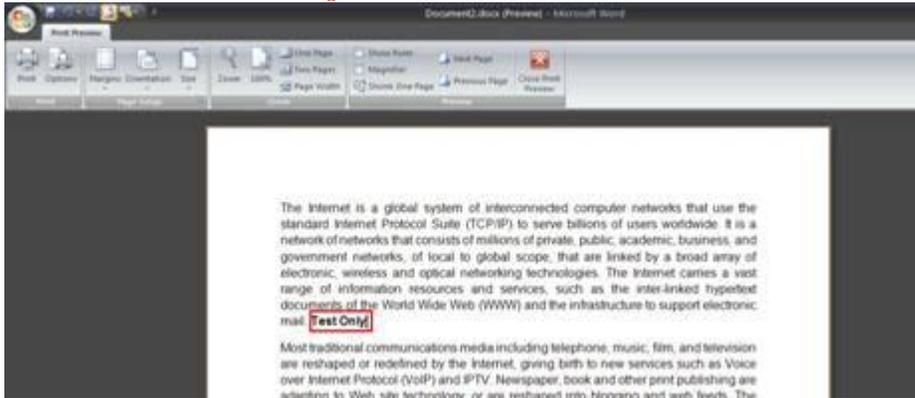

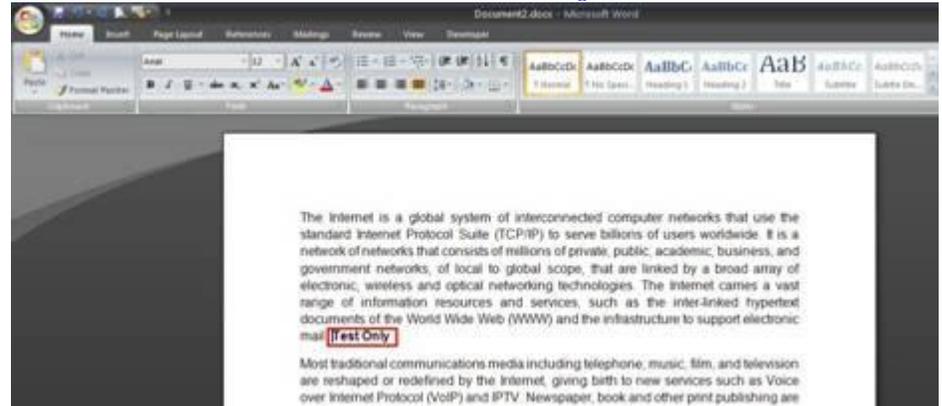
